Seminar 2 - Reading Marx Today

Marx, Mario Tronti wrote in the early 1960s, must not be confronted with *his* age but rather with *our* present. And *Das Kapital* must be evaluated with respect to *today's capitalism*. Methodically inspired from such statement, the seminar will propose a reading of Marx guided by an analysis of the mutations of capitalism and of the global turmoil that make up the present conjuncture. To do that, however, there is a need to flesh out the peculiarity and historicity of Marx's texts, to grasp their potentialities for a critical understanding of the present. Remaining aware of this historical and theoretical gap, the seminar will stage an attempt to read Marx against the background of present critical debates, organized around seven conceptual keywords. For each keyword, Marx's work will be read together with a contemporary text, which means in light of specific problematics we are confronted with today. Working through such concepts as subjectivity and world market, class struggle and exploitation, reproduction, ecology, and machines, the aim of the seminar is to contribute to the forging of a conceptual lexicon capable to articulate in new ways what the young Marx famously called "the dream of a thing," i.e. communism.

The seminar is open to undergraduate, graduate and doctoral students and to free auditors.
